Arrive at Munich Airport.

Proceed to Cesky Krumlov

Set in a meander of the Vitava River, the exquisite medieval town CESKY KRUMLOV (UNESCO heritage site) lies in the shadow of the Schwarzenberg Castle, the Czech Republic's second largest fortress. A bridge crosses a narrow isthmus leading to picturesque cobbled streets and narrow alleyways. The Town Hall is a good example of Renaissance architecture.

Above all, the huge castle on top of the north cliff catches the eye. Building began in the 13C. During the Renaissance, it was enlarged to 300 rooms and the tower acquired its elegant upper section.

After breakfast proceed to Budapest.

Enjoy a boat cruise on the Danube. The boat will be gliding through the National Park Donau-Auen

BUDAPEST is one of the finest situated cities in the world and you can enjoy this wonderful panorama from any of the peaks of the Buda hills. To one side of the Danube



spanned by eight bridges lies the plain of Pest and to the other side, we find Buda with its lovely wooded hills. You will see many interesting sights, e.g. the old castle towering above the city with its romantic castle district, the Royal Palace that has been completely reconstructed after World War II, etc. Spend the afternoon sightseeing or visit one of the Budapest museums, e. g. the Spanish Collection of the Fine Arts Museum (the richest in the world after that of El Prado in Madrid), the National Gallery or the National Museum.

KRAKÓW only recently emerged as a trendy, international hot spot, but it has always figured prominently in Polish history. The city protected centuries of central European kings and astounding architectural achievements, many of which still stand in the colourful Old Town. Between the notorious Nowa Huta steelworks from the Stalinist area to the east and the Auschwitz-Birkenau death camp 70 km to the west, Kraków has endured the darkness of the 20th century to earn UNESCO's protection as one of the world's 12 most important cultural monuments. Visitors agree, seeking out among others the many galleries in this ancient and modern city.

Your guide will take you to the castle, the St. Veit Cathedral, the Loreto-Church and the old town centre with town hall.

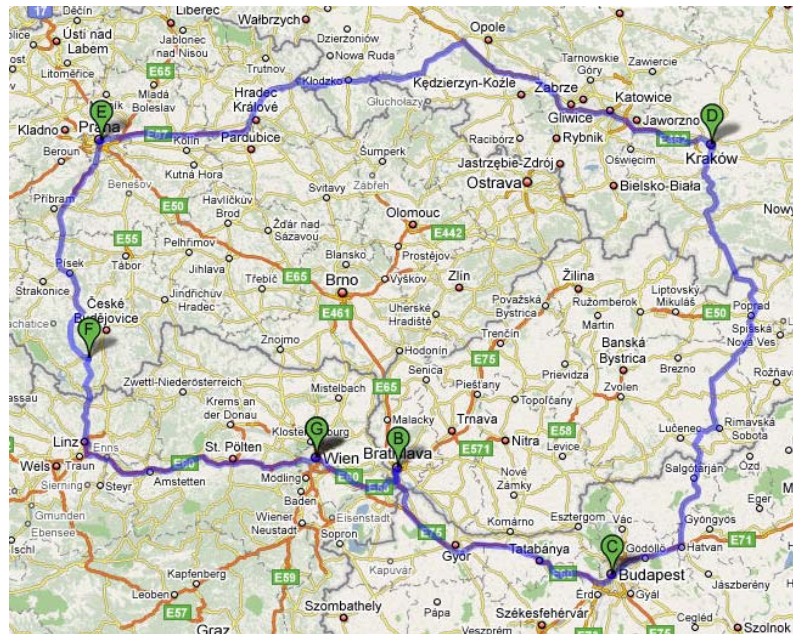
